
Introduction

The development of updated **controlled epigraphic vocabularies** is crucial for the advancement of FAIR and Open Science practices in epigraphy (Tupman 2021; Heřmánková et al. 2022).

- building upon previous work by the EAGLE Europeana Project
 (2013-2016) (Liuzzo et al. 2013; Liuzzo 2015; Liuzzo and Evangelisti
 2021) and an alignment of current standards in partner projects of
 the FAIR Epigraphy Project (https://inscriptiones.org/)
- 2 years of work by the Epigraphy.info Vocabularies working group
- bottom-up' approach to accommodate the diverse and multilingual nature of inscriptions, discipline specificity and project specificity

Key Features

- Multifaceted and multilingual hierarchical categorisation system
- Adherence to FAIR data principles (Findability, Accessibility, Interoperability, and Reusability)
- Availability as Linked Open Data (LOD) resource with stable URIs hosted by FAIR Epigraphy Project and University of Oxford
- Friendly user interface
- Linked to other FAIR resources (bibliography, ontology etc.)

Next steps

Creation of the FAIR Epigraphic Vocabularies represent a significant step towards promoting cooperation and providing a standardized resource for scholars in digital epigraphy, **but we are not done yet!**

Stage 2: more examples, more languages, improved definitions, and more vocabularies: object, material, execution, decoration, date, preservation, language (bilingualism)


